Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary Symposium on Worship and Outreach September 20-21, 2010

Many Christian churches and denominations are involved these days in debates over worship and outreach, and the issues are producing lively discussions in our own congregations as well. We Lutherans are committed to reaching out to the lost in our cities and neighbors, although we often struggle to find the best ways to share the gospel in ways that are consistent with Lutheran teaching. The struggle to balance gospel outreach with confessional Lutheranism may be most difficult when it comes to public worship: How do we plan public worship in a way that attracts the seeker to hear the Spirit's message and at the same time is a faithful proclamation of the Spirit's message?

There are loud voices on today's Christian and Lutheran scene that suggest a commitment to reach the lost and a desire to retain the historic emphases of Lutheran liturgical worship are incompatible. The Symposium on Worship and Outreach will explore these issues and offer a perspective that worship and outreach need not be mutually exclusive, pitted against each other, or outside the parameters of Lutheran history and practice. With the Spirit's guidance, the symposium will offer an encouragement to participants to strive for excellence in both gospel-centered worship and gospel-proclaiming outreach.

Pastor Starr and Pastor Luetzow from Bethel Lutheran Church, Bay City, will be attending the symposium together this year. Pastor Starr is looking forward to learning together with his son, David, a first-year student at Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary, who will also be attending the symposium as part of his training.

Outreach Pastor Report – Pastor Mark Schulz

Letters have been sent out and phone call follow-up is taking place to recruit 13 small group leaders for the next nine months. A team leader team meeting is being planned for August 25th at my home to familiarize the leaders with materials available, and ways to recruit and strengthen groups. This year I am targeting 3 new groups focusing on the 20-30 year old age bracket in our congregation.

Flyers have been dropped off at area funeral homes, and information provided in our bulletin and the last word of the Bay City times introducing our new "Grief-Share" group at Trinity. Grief-share is a 13 week video driven support group that helps people who are attempting to heal from the loss of a loved one. At our first 1 ½ hour class on August 3rd, 15 people participated. This unique group provides a benefit to our own grieving members as well as an outreach vehicle to people in our community.

I have helped coordinate another 13 week Financial Peace University class at Trinity. Flyers are being placed around town in key locations. A preview showing of the class will take place on August 26th at 6:30 P.M. in our parish hall. The 13 week class is scheduled to begin on September 16th from 6:30 to 8:30 P.M. Shannon Schwanbeck and I will be the facilitators of this class. Financial Peace University is a life-changing program that teaches you to achieve your financial goals by eliminating debt, saving for the future, and giving like never before. Financial stress is reduced. FPU strengthens members on how to handle their finances. Imagine how grand life would be if you were debt free.

I have put together a 12 month schedule for our teen ministry. Beginning in September our teens will have the opportunity to participate in two activities a month. The activities include Bible study, service project ideas, and recreational and fellowship activities. I still am devoting two Wednesday nights a month, where I call our teens on the phone and talk to them about what is happening in their life, and activities that are approaching. Recently, I called our teens and coordinated a group activity to Williamston on August 7th. The teens took our church bus to Williamston to play softball against other teens, enjoyed a great lunch, and then did some swimming at the Michigan State Pool in East Lansing. We have been averaging between 15-20 teens at our monthly activities.

One comment about our church bus. We need to make sure our church school bus is well-maintained so that we might travel safely to various activities. A bus puts all of our teens in one location, and cuts down on liability risks where you would have various parents driving other teenagers to youth activities. In addition, a bus provides a special bonding of teens where they feel more like a family and a group. Finally, it takes away stress from chaperones who have to keep an eye on these young people around the clock. Let's all support keeping our bus in top condition to support an active teen ministry at Trinity. Special thanks to Trina Middleton, Tim Heffner, and Lisa Vandriessche, our bus drivers.

I have sent out recruitment letters and put together a 3 month calendar for a Festival of Friendship Sunday on October 24th. The task force of 5 has met during the first week of August and selected a theme. The theme is:"My life was going to waste, but Jesus recycled me." Mark Virant is the head coordinator of the team. Other members are Helga Jenkins, Shelly Rau, Carol Florida, and Steve White.

It looks like we will have 7 new adult confirmands once I finish the make-up classes with several of them. We are looking to confirm these new members on August 29th in the 11:00 A.M. service. In addition, I am looking to introduce Super Saturdays on September 25th and October 2nd, where we have a marathon New Life in Christ class on those days as well as the Friday nights before the Saturday class. That way we can ask potential participants to commit to two weekends rather than a weekly 13 week class.

A funeral, 2 upcoming weddings, 3 Sheffield Bay worship services, counseling, and planning for public and day school confirmation have also kept me busy. What an active church we have at Trinity!
